

The email address is similar to a familiar one, but it is not legitimate. ST. STEPHEN WILL NEVER ASK YOU TO FORWARD FUNDS OR BUY GIFTS CARDS ON OUR BEHALF. These emails are scams. Please delete and ignore them.

COUNCIL MINUTES ~ MAY 10, 2022

The meeting opened at 5:35 pm with a devotion provided by Lloyd.

Present: Kathy Robinson, Shauna Robinson, Lloyd Zimmel, Sarah Lonsdorf, Pat Erdman, Jim Von Rueden, Verlyn Oelke, Pam Hackbart, and Jeff Blomquist. Online: Chuck Johnson and Kelly Brown

A motion was made and passed to accept the April 12, 2022 Council minutes.

Pastor's Report: No report was provided.

President's Report: A written report was provided. Lloyd recapped some of the church events from the past month.

Treasurer's Report: A written report was provided. We have \$25,702 in our General Fund.

A motion was made and carried to accept these two reports.

Committee Reports:

Education/Youth: Education Elder is on a one year substitution by Member at Large.

Good Stewards: No written report was provided.

Property: A written report was provided. Jim Von Rueden and Roger Hackbart continue to work with Cecil doing repairs to the church. They are working to make the main bathrooms handicap accessible.

Worship: A written report was provided. Discussion took place about scheduling times for future services, we will keep exploring this as we get a new pastor.

Trust Fund: No written report was provided. They haven't met yet this month.

A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

Old Business:

- Memorial Fund Review There is no change to the priority order this month. Technology Fund is still number one, Current Expense Fund is number two, and Sustainability Trust Fund is number three.
- In-person worship will continue, we ask you mask as you are comfortable and please watch online if you are ill. Pew ropes have been removed, but we ask that you continue to distance from others and be mindful of those who have masked and may have compromised health issues. Communion will continue as is for the time being. Please continue to be mindful of your church family.
- Transition update: The Call Committee has interviewed one candidate and continues to work through the call process. We have had a second interview with our candidate.
- The Good Neighbor Fund disbursement policy was approved via email vote on 5/11/2022.
- We tabled the discussion on our Wedding Policy updates.
- The Parsonage lease extension is pending. No decision has been made. The renters have requested doing electronic transfer; we will set up a Venmo account as long as they are willing to pay any fees.
- Little Scholars is looking to extend their contract with us. We will work with them to figure out terms. They are currently up to date on their rent.
- We continued our discussion on how to proceed doing nominations as a Council in the coming year.

New Business:

- A motion was made and carried to approve April bills.
- Our Sunday custodian has resigned. We placed an ad for a replacement, Mary Beth Tolley has accepted the position as a Sunday Custodian.
- Discussion took place on whether we need to update our constitution now that the Synod has passed a new constitution. It was decided we will not make any changes at this time.
- As we go through the call process, we are starting to look at the Mutual Ministry Committee for our new pastor. We will start looking for people for that committee in the future.
- We are continuing our search for Music Ministry personnel.
- The Personnel Committee updated our 2014 job description for the pastor. We have shared it with the Synod. The Council has approved their updates via motion and vote.
- Discussion took place on our current Covid Policy as far as funeral restrictions for meals. We agree it is possible again to hold meals here at church as long as the meal is fully catered. We will check with the committee who has historically done the funeral meals to make sure they have input. A motion was made and approved to go forward with this.
- We are going to look for replacements for our current video system operator before he leaves for college in the fall.
- Patty Pippenger has volunteered to do exterior flowers this summer; Kathy Seidel has generously donated funds for this and we will continue to ask for donations for this.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 14th at 5:30 pm with Chuck providing devotions.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:55 pm with the Lord's Prayer.
