

Christmas is coming! The day we celebrate Jesus's birth, Christ's coming, the arrival of Emmanuel, God with us!

Then why are our Advent readings full of messages telling us that we don't know when? We know. It's on the calendar. It's in this newsletter.

Christmas comes December 25th, this year with Sunday worship at 9:00 am. We will worship and celebrate Christ's birth on Christmas Eve, December 24th at 4:00 pm. This is of course following 4 Sundays of Advent preparation. We've been getting ready for weeks. And for the more organized of us, months already! The Combined Choir and the Bell Choir have been practicing music, getting ready for the Choral Service on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent. Christmas trees will be put up and decorated, feasts prepared, presents bought and made and wrapped, cards written (perhaps at the crafting day on Saturday, December 3?). December is all about getting ready!

Why do the Advent readings always feel so heavy? In Advent we hold space for this time of waiting, of anticipation. As Lutheran Christians, we live in a world of both/and, of now AND not yet. We proclaim the risen Christ, the presence of our Lord as "was, is, and yet to come." Our Choral Service in December will deeply explore this rich theme of waiting in exile, of living in a time when it feels like the promises of God are far away. Some of us are not ready for Christmas, a time when grief might feel more oppressive than at other times. Some anticipate the first (or fortieth) hard Christmas without their loved one present. Some of us may be struggling with all of the extra expenses this time of year. Some of us may be just hoping for things to finally, maybe seem like they are getting back to normal. Others of us may be anticipating baby's first Christmas, a renewal of old traditions, and experiencing their favorite time of year.

No matter where the timing of Christmas finds you this year, remember God's promise for you! Christ is coming! God with Us is here! Hope is real!

# Order of Importance of Memorials and Other Special Offerings

Primary Funds: Building Improvement/ Maintenance Fund, Current Expense Receipts, and Sustainability Trust Fund.

Secondary Funds: Bell Choir Fund, Brick Maintenance (tuck pointing), Choral Fund, ELCA Scholarship Fund, Good Neighbor Fund, Library Fund, Organ Fund, Quilters Memorial Fund, Parish House Alarm, Technology Fund, and WELCA Clean Water Fund.

Other Funds: Confirmation/National Youth Gathering, Faith Enrichment Fund, Major Church Improvement, Missionary Sponsorship, Rooted in Faith (Crossways Capital Improvement) Fund, Seidel/Meyer Scholarship, Seminary Scholarship, and World Hunger. The Property Committee has completed over 20 of the original projects this year, so the chart below reflects the remaining projects that are longer term or cost prohibitive right now. We will continue to work on the list as funds are available.

One of the more important items on this list, is the repair of the north basement wall of the church that is bowing in. This will be discussed at the Annual Meeting. We will be talking about our current overgrown landscaping that is too close to the foundation and needs to be redone, and we will also be talking about digging down to the foundation and putting drain tile around the church basement as well as repairing current walls that are failing.

# Christmas Symbols

### The Star Of Bethlehem

The Star of Bethlehem is a symbol of hope and miracles. When Jesus Christ was born, the Star of Bethlehem guided the Three Wise Men to Jesus. For Christians, it is a reminder of the hope that Jesus brings to the world.

### Bells

Bells are often used as Christmas symbols because they represent joy and happiness. They can also symbolize the ringing in of the New Year. Bells are often used in holiday decorations, such as wreaths and garlands. They are also a common motif in Christmas music.

### The Nativity Scene

The Nativity scene is a popular Christmas symbol that represents the birth of Jesus Christ. It typically features a baby Jesus in a manger, surrounded by Mary, Joseph, shepherds, and animals. The scene is meant to remind us of the humble beginnings of Christ and the true meaning of Christmas.

### The Christmas Tree

When we look at the Christmas tree, we are reminded of the hope and joy that the holiday brings. 

# **IMPORTANT TAX INFORMATION**

Checks and money must be delivered by hand or mail, and postmarked on or before December 31, 2022 in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2022. Checks that are placed in the church offering at the first service of January 2023, WILL NOT QUALIFY FOR A CHARITABLE DEDUCTION IN 2022, even if the check was dated for 2022, or was actually written in 2021.

To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions, please do not file your 2022 income tax return until you have received a written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church. You may lose a deduction for some contributions if you file your tax return before receiving a written acknowledgment.

The meeting opened at 5:30 pm with devotions by Kathy Robinson.

### A motion was made and passed to accept the October 11, 2022 Council minutes.

Pastor's Report: A written report was provided.

President's Report: A written report was provided.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: A written report was provided. We have \$22,707 in our General Fund. Verlyn gave a brief update on our finances. The air conditioning bill has been paid; we will wait to take the funds from our investment account until a more opportune time.

#### A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

#### Committee Reports:

Education/Youth: Education Elder is on a one year substitution by Member at Large.

**Good Stewards:** Kelly said things are going well.

**Property:** A lengthy written report was provided outlining all the needed repairs at St. Stephen. Jim recapped some of the items on the to-do list, many have been done, but there are still many on the list. We have closed out 20 of the 53 projects! Yay! We will start using the electronic door codes on December 1<sup>st</sup>. If you require a code or key card/fob to enter the building, please contact Roger Hackbart.

Worship: A written report was provided. They will be meeting Thursday again.

**Trust Fund:** A written report was provided. Our earnings have gone up this month, but we are down year-to-date. The audit bill has been paid, and funds have been dispersed to some local charities.

### A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

Old Business:

- Memorial Fund Review There **will be** a change to the priority order this month. The Building Improvement and Maintenance Fund is now number one, Current Expense is number two, and Sustainability Trust Fund is number three.
- We are working on our Wedding Policy updates.
- We have started getting some names for next year's Council, but are still looking for some volunteers. Our Constitution requires that we fill many spots on the Council. **PLEASE CONSIDER VOLUNTEERING.**
- The 2023 Budget Meeting will be next Tuesday, November 15th at 5:30 pm. Verlyn distributed preliminary numbers to Council which will continue to evolve as the process continues. We will focus on expenses at next week's meeting.
- We are training more people for running the Sunday video equipment.

#### New Business:

- A motion was made and carried to approve October bills.
- Kathy Robinson shared that she is going to pursue a degree from Wartburg Seminary to become an ordained minister. There is a \$600 candidacy fee required to begin the process, oftentimes it is covered by a candidate's congregation. A motion was made to use the Seminary Scholarship Fund to sponsor this fee. The motion passed, with Kathy abstaining from the vote.
- Crossways Camping is looking for delegates from congregations to attend a meeting in December. If you are interested in representing St. Stephen, please contact Nancy.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 13th at 5:30 pm, with Pam providing devotions.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:55 pm with the Lord's Prayer.


