On Sunday, December 4th, 55 people attended the 9:00 am Worship Service.

Our sincere sympathy to the family of Arnie Lange, whose funeral service was held at St. Stephen Lutheran Church on Thursday, December 8th.

On November 27th, St. Stephen hosted a Community Dinner at First Presbyterian Church. We served 100 meals! All dinner guests picked up their meals to go which consisted of one ham and one egg salad sandwich, a bottle of water, an apple, a bag of potato chips, cookies, a rice crispy treat, and chocolate. The Good Stewards Committee organized this event and would like to thank those who donated purchased or homemade cookies; these are always a hit with the dinner guests. We would also like to thank those who donated money during the coffee hour that Sunday as proceeds went to support this dinner. Thank you to those who helped transport the items for the meals and the 12 members from St. Stephen who prepared sandwiches and packed and handed out the meals. Thanks to all who contributed financially, and a special thank you to the Trust Fund Committee for their generous financial support.

Thank you to everyone at St. Stephen who contributed winter apparel or donated money to our annual Coats for Kids Drive. This year we collected 23 coats, 30 hats, mittens, and scarves, and 3 pairs of snow pants. Thank you for helping keep area kids warm this winter and a special thank you to Linda Salzman for organizing the drive this year.

We are looking for an additional Sunday Custodian, 2 to 3 hours per Sunday. Duties include: opening up the church, lighting candles, turning on lights, and turning on and monitoring the sound board. 
