Food Drive

For the month of February, the Angels will be holding a food drive to help the Food Pantry at First Presbyterian Church (a couple of blocks north of us). This local pantry helps 70-80 family units (twice a week) every month. The items that are most needed include: peanut butter (16 oz.), cans of fruit or vegetables, Tuna Helper (no Hamburger Helper), baked beans (15 oz.), cans of spaghetti sauce, and any type of pasta. Remember, no glass containers. The table at the entrance to the sanctuary will be available for food donations. Let's help a local pantry and our neighbors in need.

Benevolence

Through your support of St. Stephen in the month of December 2023, we were able to contribute to the following ministry:

ELCA National & Synod Support \$823

This is the eleventh month of our unified budget in which we now give four and one half percent (4.5%) of our current expense receipts and loose plate offerings for benevolence. The above amount is based on the income of \$18,290 for December.

Order of Importance of Memorials and Other Special Offerings

Lenten/Holy Week Worship Opportunities

There are several opportunities for Midweek Lenten Services this year. St. Stephen will be having Lenten Soup Lunch Services on the following Wednesdays: February 21st and 28th, and March 6th, 13th, and 20th. These services will be held in our Downstairs Auditorium at 12:15pm. Soup will be served beginning at noon. Lenten Soup Suppers will be held at Pilgrim at 5:30pm with a service to follow at 6:30pm. Lenten Services will be held at Good Shepherd at 5:30pm with a Soup Supper to follow. St. Stephen members are invited to attend any or all of the services.

St. Stephen, Pilgrim, and Good Shepherd Lutheran Churches are sharing services for Holy Week this year. Each congregation will plan the service held at their location. Ash Wednesday will be held at Pilgrim on February 14th at 6:30pm, Maundy Thursday will be held at Good Shepherd on March 28th at 6:30pm, and Good Friday will be held at St. Stephen on March 29th at 6:30pm. Each congregation will have their own Easter Sunday Service. St. Stephen's Easter Service will be held at 10:30am this year.

Lenten Soup Lunches

The Midweek Lenten Soup Lunch Services are returning for 2024! Stephen's Angels will provide soup for the first two services (February 21st & 28th). There will be a sign-up sheet on the front counter staring on February 1st for anyone interested in bringing a soup, bread, or dessert or helping with set-up and/or clean-up.

Little Free Pantry

The Good Stewards Committee is asking for food donations for the little free pantry outside of the church. We can use things like canned meat, peanut butter, pasta, hamburger helper, cereal, etc. We just ask that it not be in a glass container or contain carbonation. St. Stephen Trust Fund

St. Stephen Lutheran Church established a Trust Fund in 1988 as an investment in our future. There are two funds invested through Financial First Advisors in Wausau. The Trust Fund Committee is responsible for these funds and uses only a percentage of the earnings for the designated projects. The Wider Mission Fund is to support the wider mission of the Church in our community and globally. Examples would include: The Neighbors' Place, Faith in Action, Open Door, the Wausau Warming Center, Homeless Kids Fund, Lutheran World Relief, and others. The Building Preservation Fund is for the preservation of our church buildings. In the past this has included fixing the elevator, parsonage updates, and organ repair as well as other repair projects. St. Stephen is known for its generosity. Because only the interest earned on each fund is used in our outreach missions, it is important to maintain a solid investment balance. Please keep the St. Stephen Trust Fund in mind when doing your estate planning. You can designate a specific fund or project, or make a general reference to the Trust Fund.

Present: Pastor Karoline, Pam Hackbart, Sarah Lonsdorf, Verlyn Oelke, Jim Von Rueden, Shauna Robinson, Sue Holster, Jacque Schremp, Lloyd Zimmel, and Vicki Romang.

The meeting opened at 5:30 pm following the Executive Council meeting.

A motion was made and passed to accept the December 12, 2023 Council minutes.

Pastor's Report: No written report was provided. Pastor Karoline discussed the possibility of sharing some space in the basement with a group called New Beginnings. Discussions are in the process to coordinate Lenten services between St. Stephen, Good Shepherd, and Pilgrim. A noon service will be held at St. Stephen and evening services will be held at Good Shepherd and Pilgrim. St. Stephen will hold an Easter service.

Treasurer's Report: Our general fund currently has a balance of \$22,165.
