"I've been meaning to ask..."

This is the theme of our shared Round Robin worship series, designed to create community and to deepen our relationship with God and one another.

Over the last 2 years, I've truly enjoyed getting to know you and

listening to your stories. It has been an honor to walk alongside families through joy and through grief. And I look forward to getting to know you better as we go forth in ministry together. So I begin my third year of ordained ministry with you with a question and an invitation...

First, a question: What makes you feel welcome? Truly welcome. As in "welcome home" kind of welcome. The come in, help yourself to a drink from the fridge, put your feet up kind of welcome. And how do we help you find that here? Because you are not just welcome here, but you belong. You are a vital part of our community. You are created in the Image of God and God claims you as God's own.

Next, the invitation: to a new conversation. My experience of St. Stephen is that we are warm, welcoming, and that our connections run deep. But sometimes deep, long term connections can make it harder for newcomers to feel at home. Let's look together at the ways in which we can invite others to experience our faith community and help them feel connected. I've often heard the phrase amongst young folk wishing to increase inclusivity, "Be a croissant, not a donut." A donut is a closed circle and a croissant leaves an opening. The idea is that by intentionally creating space and observing our body language, we can be more invitational for others to join our conversation and community.

We love because God first loved us.

I love hearing stories of meaningful moments and dreaming together for the future of our church. Let's ask each other some questions and deeply listen to one another's response.

Community Baby Shower

St. Stephen Lutheran Church is hosting a Community Baby Shower on August 11th. We are looking for donations of the following items: hygiene items (diaper cream, body wash, lotion, shampoo, etc.), diapers or Pull- Ups (larger sizes are greatly needed), sippy cups, bottles, pacifiers, bibs, food (baby formula Blue Similac is most requested, baby foods, teething snacks). All items need to be new/unused condition. All donations will be going to The Babies Place the week of August 12th. They have requested no clothing items. An interesting fact for The Babies Place is they have no budget for hygiene items so they rely solely on donations.

Lutheran World Relief

It's time to start thinking about Lutheran World Relief Kits! Our goal is to assemble 75 Personal Care Kits and 70 School Kits. You can help by donating the following items: bath towels (dark colors), bar soap (4oz. bars), 70-80 page spiral notebooks wide or college ruled (no loose-leaf paper), black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink), nail clippers, pencil sharpeners, unsharpened pencils, and crayons (24 count). We will be assembling the kits on Thursday, September 26th beginning at 8:30am. Anyone in the congregation is welcome to come and help us assemble the kits, pack them, and get them ready for shipping. Donated items can be placed in the Quilting Room/Nursery or under the coat rack across from the elevator on the first floor. If you have any questions, please talk to any of the quilters.

Personal Hygiene Drive

A Personal Hygiene Drive will be held July 1st through August 25th. We are asking for feminine hygiene items such as deodorant, pads, tampons, etc. to donate to the local schools to provide kids with needed items who may not otherwise have access to these items. Donations will be going to DC Everest School District as well as the Wausau School District.

COUNCIL MINUTES ~ JULY 9, 2024

Present: Pastor Karoline, Sue Holster, Dick Holster, Verlyn Oelke, Vicki Romang, Jeff Blomquist, Sarah Lonsdorf, Darrin Koehler, Jacque Schremp, Nancy Prigge, and Shauna Robinson.

Absent: Kathy Robinson and Lynn Deffner.

The meeting opened at 5:30 p.m. with Sue Holster reading to the Council a story from a Portals of Prayer book her father-in-law received from St. Stephen Sunday School in 1957.

Council Minutes from May 14, 2024: The minutes were updated by removing a sentence concerning the summer worship services indicating there is a service one Sunday of each month. The services are to be held each Sunday starting July 21st and ending on August 11th. The minutes were approved with this correction.

Pastor's Report: A verbal report was given by Pastor Karoline. She discussed revisions in the process of being made to the current wedding policy. Flowers used during the ceremony can be real or artificial, versus only real as in the past. Shauna Robinson is currently training to be a wedding coordinator for weddings at St. Stephen.

President's Report: A verbal report was given by Sue Holster. Sue discussed points she took away from the Presidents' meetings. The items were how church congregations in the area are working together, and how we can improve situations by improving communication skills between church congregations. We also discussed the need to have volunteers to work the First English food stand at the Valley Fair in Wausau next month.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: The Council did not meet in June, therefore Verlyn Oelke discussed the reports for the months of May and June. The Total Capital as of June 30, 2024 is \$4,571.

A motion was made and passed to accept these reports.

Committee Reports:

Good Stewards: The committee is busy with many different projects: the Little Free Pantry, a Community Baby Shower, replenishing the shelves at The Neighbors' Place, and working to support the Marty Bus to name a few. The Marty Bus provides hygiene items, clothing, and food to people in need in the central Wisconsin area. Due to the overwhelming need in our area, it is difficult for the committee to keep our Little Free Pantry filled every day. If you would like to contribute, contact a committee member or feel free to add items to the pantry.

Property: The committee continues to work hard. Krause Konstruction will begin the work on the church roof on Monday, July 15th. A new lawn mower and battery was purchased for greater efficiency, maintaining the lawn in a shorter amount of time. The carpets in the church have been cleaned. The committee is also investigating issues with the elevator stopping on the wrong floor. The energy monitor in the basement indicated areas that may be utilizing too much energy. One of the things utilizing more energy than is warranted is the soda machine. The committee is looking into solutions to this and other high energy absorption.

Worship: Volunteers are needed for our coffee hour. If you are interested, there is a sign-up sheet in the chapel.

The dates of the summer services and locations are listed below. Each service will have a different theme.

July 21st: Good Shepherd will host. The theme will be, Where are you from?

July 28th: Pilgrim Lutheran will host. The theme will be, Where does it hurt?

August 4th: Immanuel Lutheran will host. The theme will be, What do you need?

August 11th: St. Stephen will host. The theme will be, Where do we go from here?

Trust Fund: The committee approved distributions to Waypost, Special Olympics of Wisconsin, Community Campus, and Good Stewards for stocking the Little Pantry this summer.

A motion was made and passed to accept these reports.

Old Business:

Memorial Fund Order – No changes this month. Building Improvement and Maintenance Fund is number one, Current Expense
Fund in number two, Sustainability Trust Fund is number three, and Technology Fund in number four. Upgrades have been made
to the projection/video area.

New Business:

- The total amount of invoices paid in June was \$15,698.41 and \$28,439 for May.
- Capital Campaign The progress to obtain a loan to repair the roof to the church is moving forward. The group is seeking an adjustable rate (7.125%) for 10 years that we hope to repay in 5 years. Pledges are still being collected. A total of \$27,206 in one-time pledges and \$38,290 in annual pledges have been received from 52% of St. Stephen members.
- Taskforce Update The SSLC taskforce met with the taskforce from Good Shepherd and looks forward to meeting with the taskforce at Pilgrim Lutheran Church in the near future.

The next Council meeting will be on Tuesday, August 13th at Waypost.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 7:40 p.m.
