I'm a sucker for hand turkeys. Really any art with my kid's handprints on it. I've been sorting through piles of the kids' art from over the years and every time I come across one with handprints it automatically goes in the "keep" pile. There are so many varieties of this style of art now: butterflies, reindeer, the sun, flamingos, trees, elephants, flowers, enough to fill the whole year beyond November. But the classic hand turkey remains my favorite.



The handprint reminds me of a neat little reminder for prayer, the 5 fingered prayer. Like handprints, there are several varieties of this prayer. One version is a reminder to pray for family and friends, teachers, leaders and government workers, the weak and sick, and for ourselves. Another version reminds us of the parts of prayer. In this one, the pinkie represents confession, because it is the weakest finger. The ring finger represents praying for our needs and the middle finger is for the needs of others. The pointer finger reminds us to pray in thanksgiving, thankful for everything in God's creation, thankful for everything we can point to. And the thumb represents praise, giving a big thumbs up to God!

We have much to be thankful for, and this prayer reminds us to thank and praise. But it also directs us to pray in everything we do. November is a season for thankfulness and it is also a season for leaning on God in faith, for generosity, for outreach, and for so much more.

Our Advent theme for this year is "Words for the Beginning." Once again, there is beautiful artwork and poetry that accompanies this theme. This year, much of the imagery has a guilting theme.

Each year we have a Choral Service in which our many musicians are able to share their musical gifts in offering. This year, we would like to create a display of visual artwork to enhance our worship as well. These artworks are to be inspired by our Advent themes and Bible verses and will be displayed during the Choral Service. The artwork can be of any media: paintings, sculpture, quilting, etc. If you are interested in participating, please contact Pastor Karoline.

COUNCIL MINUTES ~ OCTOBER 8, 2024

Present: Pastor Karoline, Sue Holster, Dick Holster, Verlyn Oelke, Vicki Romang, Jeff Blomquist, Sarah Lonsdorf, Shauna Robinson, Lynn Deffner, Nancy Prigge, Darrin Koehler, and Jacque Schremp.

Absent: Kathy Robinson.

Sue Holster led the meeting with a prayer.

Council Minutes from September 10, 2024: A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes without any changes.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: A coaching session was conducted by Pastor Cath Mode in September. She is an experienced leader in church transition and redevelopment. Pastor Mode discussed opportunities available. This session was partly funded through the Synod. Saturday Crafterdays will be held on October 12th, November 23rd, and December 14th. Grief Share will be offered at St. Stephen on Monday evenings February through April.

<u>President's Report</u>: Sue Holster brought forth a topic discussed at the President's monthly meeting. Sue relayed that the south side churches (St. John Lutheran, Bethlehem, and Mount Calvary) are working on a 3-point parish. Also discussed was an opportunity to rent the sanctuary to a group called Candlelight. The group will perform a classical music concert by the use of LED candles. The rental of the sanctuary will bring a revenue of \$1,500. The Council unanimously approved the rental of the sanctuary. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Our total capital is \$6,141. This amount is expected to go up with the increase of Sunday service attendance. The attendance has been down recently due to summer activities/vacations.

A motion was made and carried to accept the reports.

Committee Reports:

Good Stewards: The Community Dinner was rescheduled to be held on November 24th at First Presbyterian. The Little Free Pantry has been utilized heavily. Donations are welcome.

Property: Krause Konstruction continues to work on the roof repair. Krause Konstruction is working to repair a window that was broken during the construction project. Their contract will then be complete. Some of the windowsills may need to be replaced (stained glass windows). Jeff Blomquist is gathering the information needed to go forward.

Worship: The Worship committee will meet next on Thursday, October 10th.

Trust Fund: Distributions approved for Trunk or Treat event and for the down payment of the loan for roof repairs.

A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

Old Business:

• Memorial Fund Order – Current Expense Fund is number one, Building Improvement and Maintenance Fund in number two, Sustainability Trust Fund in number three, and Technology Fund in number four.

New Business:

- The total amount of invoices paid in September was \$20,589.
- Capital Campaign The loan for the roof was budgeted at \$180,000. The amount needed to borrow is \$125,000. Approval was granted for a construction loan of \$125,000 with a monthly payment of \$1,459 for 10 years.
- Taskforce Update The St. Stephen Taskforce met in September to discuss the current list of important issues to our church and congregation. After discussing the issues, it was discovered the importance of some issues may have changed. It is imperative to keep on track of what we find essential to us. The Taskforce realizes that there is a need to be more transparent with the status of the church. Suggestions include adding notes to the bulletin for members who may not be able to attend town hall discussions and to remind members of upcoming meetings, possibly adding to the church website.
- 2025 Budget Additions to be added to the 2025 budget are professional fees and loan payments. A draft is expected at the November Executive Council meeting with a final approval to be made during the December Executive Council meeting.
- Stephen's Angels The Angels are currently working on the basket auction and are creating gift bags for shut-ins. If you know of someone that would like to be added to this list, please contact Lynn Deffner or another Angel member.
- Nominating Committee Dick Holster is starting the process of finding volunteers to fill the open positions available, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Good Stewards Elder, Member-at-large (3 positions), and Trust Fund (1 position).

The next Council meeting will be on Tuesday, November 12, 2024, at 5:30 pm.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 pm.
