

"wHOILY Experience: A Lenten Journey" has been our theme for our midweek Lenten Worship this year and it has been a feast for the senses.

The first couple of weeks of our shared services have been a delicious success (apart from and even in spite of heavy snow!). Each week has had a different sense as a theme and we've been exploring how we tangibly experience our faith. As leaders from Good Shepherd, Pilgrim, and St. Stephen dreamed, brainstormed, and planned for Lent, we were suggesting names and as one particular idea was spoken, we knew it would be the one we would be going with. But which version of holy/wholly would we use? Living into the "both/and" of our Lutheran heritage, we decided both!

Holy: Think about the sacred ways we encounter God. Through scripture, worship, proclamation, and sacrament, we are invited to experience Jesus' embodied divinity as bigger than ourselves. We are invited into the promises of grace and love.

Wholly: We experience God through the fullness of our senses and experience. Through the sacraments of baptism and communion, there are tangible elements that we can taste and see and touch.

Holey? In this season, we remember the fullness of Jesus' humanity and divinity: God with us. Hands and feet that bear the holes of crucifixion. Resurrection revealed through the hole of a tomb.

During Lent, Holy Week, and Easter, come and experience.

Experience sight, sound, scent, touch, and taste.

Experience trust, protection, repentance, reconciliation, and renewal.

Experience the fanfare and celebration of Palm Sunday.

Experience the connection of Maundy Thursday.

Experience the grief of Good Friday.

Experience the joy and new life of Easter!



Thank you to all who donated food and/or money to purchase food for the First Presbyterian Food Bank. With the money donated from members and also the Trust Fund, we were able to purchase (this is in addition to the tableful of donated items): 72 cans of tuna, 24 boxes of pasta, 24 cans of beef stew, 2-20# bags of rice, 36 cans of tomato pieces, 48 cans of chicken, and 48 eggs. This food pantry has been servicing 87 families weekly and the manager expressed his gratitude to St. Stephen for helping to restock their shelves.

Ukrainian Easter Egg Project

Let's make some Ukrainian Easter Eggs!!! Join us at Pilgrim Lutheran Church on Saturday, April 12th at 9:30am. A centuries-old tradition called pysanky in Ukraine. Eggs are decorated with patterns and symbols using wax and dye. Materials and instructions will be available at the event, so just bring yourself, your family, and friends. Because of the use of heated wax, plastic eggs (and no wax) will be given to children. If you would like to participate, a sign-up sheet is located on the counter in the reception area. Deadline to sign up is Sunday, March 30th. This is a multigenerational shared ministry event of Good Shepherd, Pilgrim, and St. Stephen.

Benevolence

Secondary Funds: Bell Choir Fund, Brick Maintenance (tuck pointing), Choral Fund, ELCA Scholarship Fund, Good Neighbor Fund, Library Fund, Organ Fund, Quilters Memorial Fund, Parish House Alarm, Technology Fund, and WELCA Clean Water Fund.

See the weekly chart below for a schedule of serving ministries. Our goal is to bring groups together to get to know each other through serving and fellowship! If you are able to help, reach out to the contact person below, to get connected for a specific date. Each ministry will then coordinate a menu, the specific volunteer roles needed and where or how you would like to direct that day's freewill offering.

Each week we will provide for approximately 25-40 lunch worshipers and 60-75 for the evening meal. Numbers are estimates at this point. Groups should plan to have volunteers for setup, serving, dishwashing, and cleanup for lunch and supper. Meals can consist of: at least 2 choices of soup (remember our vegan and gluten free friends), bread/crackers, dessert, milk, and salads (optional). We estimate 1 roaster for noon and 2 for evening.

Each week's meals will offer a freewill offering basket, and designation of the day's funds collected will go towards the ministry or designation selected by the sponsoring group.

COUNCIL MINUTES ~ MARCH 11, 2025

Present: Dick Holster, Vicki Romang, Jim Von Rueden, Betsy Utecht, Pastor Karoline, Shauna Robinson, Jeff Blomquist, Sarah Lonsdorf, Nelda Hettinga, Darrin Koehler, Nancy Prigge, and Jacque Schremp.

Absent: Sue Holster.

Council Minutes from February 11, 2025 meeting: The minutes were amended to reflect that the Trust Fund Committee met on February 16, 2025.

A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes with this change.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor Karoline provided a written report. In addition, it was noted that the synod will be holding a Church Council Academy via Zoom on March 22nd and 27th with keynote speaker Nancy Heykes.

Treasurer's Report: The General Fund total is \$18,454.73 and the total capital is \$11,990.

A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

Committee Reports:

Good Stewards: No written report was provided. Community on Call was activated for five nights and was a success. St. Stephen will look to participate again in the future. Tracy Rieger requested \$650 for a rental deposit for an individual in need. That amount was paid by Laurie Sturzenegger from Good Shepherd. St. Stephen will reimburse Laurie for 1/3 of that amount. A request was made for the Trust Fund Committee to provide seed money to the Community Outreach Fund to provide funding for future rental assistance requests.

Property: No written report was provided. The Property Committee did not meet last month. The smoke alarm in the attic of the church has gone off four times, but each time it was only a fault. A service call will take place this week. There have been issues during the past month with both boilers.

Trust Fund: Written reports were provided from the February 16, 2025 and March 9, 2025 committee meetings.

Worship: A written report was provided from the February 13, 2025 committee meeting.

A motion was made and carried to accept these reports.

Old Business:

• Memorial Fund Order – No change to the order this month. Current Expense Fund is number one, Building Improvement and Maintenance Fund is number two, and Sustainability Trust Fund is number three.

New Business:

- Invoice Approval—The total amount of invoices paid in February was \$21,429.66.
- A motion was made and carried to approve the paid invoices.
- Noisy Offering—March 16th
- For the foreseeable future, donations from the Noisy Offerings will be added to the Community Outreach Fund.
- Capital Campaign—First withdrawal was made this month and second payment of principal.
- Task Force—At its next meeting, the Task Force will be discussing next steps, including where St. Stephen, Good Shepherd, and Pilgrim see ourselves at the end of 2025. The focus will be on defining our options and getting a clearer picture of what our common goal is.
- Synod Youth Retreat update—The retreat took place from February 21st to 23rd at Imago Dei Village. Six students and three adults from St. Stephen, Good Shepherd, and Immanuel attended. Money from the Youth Fund covered half of the cost for each student. The students signed a thank you note expressing their gratitude for the funds provided. Opportunities exist for youth and families to attend camp through Crossways Camping Ministries over the summer, potentially with financial support from St. Stephen.
- Church Council Retreat—March 16th from 11:30 am to 3:00 pm, at the Nest at Big Brothers Big Sisters.
- Goals for 2025—Review Constitution & Bylaws; provide information about memorial funds to promote their use for their intended purposes; update membership list; compile church directory with photos.
- Synod Assembly—June 7th in Green Bay; two lay voting members are needed.
- Opportunity to make Ukrainian Easter Eggs—April 12th at 9:30 am at Pilgrim.

The next Council meeting will be on Tuesday, April 8, at 5:30 pm.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 7:00 pm.
